I was persuaded by Gareth to sign up for this race a few months ago (it always sells out within a hours), but hadn't realised what I'd let myself in for until early last week when I discovered it was further than I expected at 10 miles, and had a number of particularly

muddy and unpleasant sections, including a sheep dip, lots of bog and a long section of water filled ditch.

Despite this, the event was very fun with Gareth, Robin and I representing from Team Bath AC. Prior to the start there was at 11:00 a moving rendition of the Last Post before a silence. With that it was off to the start line, and following the advice of Robin and Gareth (who have both completed the event several times) of going hard at the start to avoid queues for gates and ditches once the off road stuff starts I made my way to front where I was pleasantly surprised by the lack of Bristol and West and Bristol Uni Cross Country club runners (who have put in strong performances in previous years). Following the advice I set off fairly hard and it it was quickly clear that three of us had thoughts of going for the win. Over the following miles there followed a lot of chopping and changing between the three of us, a few brief wrong turns from me, and lots of great scenery and soggy running. I eventually finished second, having lost the lead after coming out of a long water filled ditch and then finding it hard to get my legs going again once I'd finally managed to clamber out onto the last couple of km of fast road action at the end.

Gareth and Robin both had great runs, with Robin coming in at 59th out of the 1000 odd runners (despite having possibly fractured his thumb while showboating over a jump) and Gareth knocked minutes of his time last year despite the 2018 course being longer.

We are always massively spoilt for choice for trail races around here at this time of year, but I'd definitely recommend this one.
