The Dartmoor Big Day Out - Great Escape 24 August

'Only mad dogs and Englishmen go out in the midday sun" - and trail runners! The Dartmoor Great Escape is a 15 1/2 mile race from Princetown to Ivybridge straight across southern Dartmoor. It's a downhill route with a few surprisingly technical uphills. The route crosses the head of the Erme Valley and traverses the Erme canyons, with some interesting moorland vistas along the Abbots Way before the long descent into Ivybridge. After a 2.23 hrs time for the Two Tunnels Half marathon the week before, training was on target for a sub 3 hr time. However, the Saturday sun and 28 degree temperature put paid to that and even taking on over 2 litres of water and making use of the two food stations my time was slower than expected in 3 hrs 8 mins. Consolation was 79th from 145 finishers and 3rd Men Vet 60. After a hiccop with medals all finishers were offered either a cider or beer as well needed post race hydration. For trail racers a good well organised event by Puretrail.uk and there is a 36 miler held at the same time from North to the South across the moor. Certainly one to look forward to next year. This was run to benefit Macmillan Cancer Care Charity and the Justgiving page is still open.
