English National Cross Country Championship26th February

Staged at Parliament Hill Fields, London, for the 17th time; some describe the venue as the home of cross country and it is certainly is a testing course no matter what the conditions are like. The senior men's race had 3,027 entries, while 1,475 entered the senior women's. The younger age groups also enjoyed a strong turnout with both U13 age groups 500+. An enormous 7,960 total runners were entered across the 10 races.

A good turn out from the TBAC Senior Men - a great team performance - they should all be very proud. Aidan Daniel was again our leading man. For the 6 scoring men we finished 37th with 3082 points out of 132 scoring teams.

Only 3 Senior Ladies managed the run with Amy Glynn finishing a creditable 361st, Phillippa Spruit 591st, and Lisa Bennett 662nd.

The Junior Women had excellent runs with Freya Spruit finishing 47th, Ella Treby 90th and India Ibbotson 92nd. All in the top 100.

Alex Parsons finished an impressive 36th in the Junior Men.







English National Cross Country Championship 26th February

A select team of Team Bath juniors travelled to the capital on Saturday for the English National Cross Country Championships. The venue at Parliament Hill is an iconic course for English cross country with a long steep hill to start, lashings of mud and even more hills to finish the legs off! The views across to the skyscrapers of London were particularly stunning in the glorious sunshine, a welcome change to the weather from recent weeks.

The results were as stunning as the weather!

Harry Maxwell lapped up the mud and hills, with a breakthrough performance, an incredible 3rd in the Under 15 Boys. His twin brother Joshua also had a strong run coming 36th, against a field of around 400 of the country's best athletes.

Tobi-Lee Loughlin continued Team Bath's amazing Championship, with an amazing 10th in the U13 boys race.

Sophie Maxwell wasn't to be outdone by the boys, with a fine 36th in her first National level event, and a year left in the U13 age group.

Dylan Stoneman finished off the junior races with a strong 150th in the U17 race.





Big South Championships, North Carolina, USABy Caroline Howorth

Rob Howorth won the 800m at the Big South Championship at the JDL Fast Track in Winston-Salem, North Carolina; setting a Championship best performance of 1:51.99 and PB in the process.

An hour and a half earlier, he also came away with a silver medal in the men's mile final in a time of 4:09.27. He was representing Charleston Southern University (North Carolina) where he is currently studying for a Masters Degree in Business.

led the way for the women, with a rapid 18:54 also at Poole (obviously a Parkrun worth a visit at some point). Notable performances from some of our vets too with Jo Thompson and Niall Urquhart split by just 5 seconds in their respective V60 categories.

The Club 5k Championship saw further entries, although it is early days and it will take a little time for a clear picture to emerge. Mike Dooley looks set to be the first to complete the full set of six parkruns, with just Bath and Chipping Sodbury to go. He looks set to have most of the year to try and improve on the already impressive times set. The women's competition could become interesting with Caitlin Wosika leading Issy Davis by just 18 seconds and although Alex Binley is a minute behind, that was a time run at the somewhat slower Bath Skyline course.
