

385 runners set off up the High Street in a very warm 25 degrees C. This was a much depleted race field based on the number of entrants, with the hot weather clearly keeping many runners away. For those that know the 2019 route (pre-covid) the first 5k offers more of a challenge than the last 5k. There is much undulation and stony cycle path to negotiate early on. The stony old railway path/route, is certainly NOT super shoe friendly!

The course was well marshalled and supported with drinks stations at 3 & 6k. On a tough night the Winning Male (**Johnny Suttle**) clocked a solid performance of **33:12**.

Several of the junior athletes took part in The South-West Schools Track & Field Championships took place in Exeter on Saturday 18th June with several of our junior athletes taking part and achieving three 1st places, four 2nd places and two 3rd places.

In the high jump there was a silver medal for newcomer Peter Krunity Salako in the Inter boys event with 1.77, and a bronze for Ciara Galvin in the Inter girls with 1.54, whilst there was a silver medal for Alice Wilson in the Inter girls long jump with 5.37.

On the track, there were gold medals for Dylan Stoneman in the Inter boys 1500 s/c in 4.34.92 and Charlie Staddon in the Inter boys 400m hurdles in 57.11, with a silver in the 100 hurdles in 14.35. Other silver medals went to Joe Markey in the U/17 400m in 53.19 and Harry Maxwell in the Inter boys 3000m in 9.09.82.
