


Hazelbury Hurrah!

With an entrance fee of just £8 for an affiliated runner online, and £10 on the night, this represents great value for club runners chasing a seasons best or PB. Please note the next two races are scheduled for Wed Aug 10th 7:15pm and Wed 14th Sept 7:15pm respectively. With a race licence issued via UKA and therefore linked to Run Britain/Power of 10, all results will appear in your Run Britain accounts and go towards your running handicap

109 runners congregated on the main road sandwiched by the Yeovilton Air Base. With the stationery jets, helicopters close by, it created a real buzz as all runners charged along the fast straight of road that takes you to the first corner! And boy it was a quick start, with the smell of super shoe rubber burning in the warm summers evening's air (23 degrees).

The one lap course is such that even the three main corners and S-Bends can be taken at speed with no slowing down required!! The final 1k is completely flat, straight and painful if you have over-cooked it in the earlier stages of the race
