TBAC used to enter these 5k road relays when they were held in Clevedon, though getting teams was always difficult due to the August Bank Holiday date.

Andy Mullet, Tom Hutchison and Niall Urquart entered a MV60 team. We won with a combined time of about 65 minutes. In second place were Westbury. Only two V60 teams mind you: but you have to be in it to win it.

There were about 50 teams in all: Westbury entered a huge team in every age category, as did Clevedon. I have not seen the official results yet, so can't give you any more details. I can just say that at the young end there were lots of 16-minute laps.

One interesting innovation was that this year there were at least three Parkrun mixed teams. The organisers hoping that perhaps new recruits might find their way to the EA registered local clubs.

Race entry was £5 and it was great to see an event with a break-even budget.

The venue at Cleeve Cricket Club was lovely, particularly with the sunny weather. The course dropped 30 metres in the first 2k then slowly climbed back with one big square lap of local open but quiet roads, well marshalled and organised.

At the end, the organisers gave TBAC a shout out for getting there for the first time in a few years. Readers, you would all have loved it, let's get a few more teams next year.

2022 World Triathlon Multisport Championships: Aquabike 21st August

My gold at the ITU Long Distance Tri World Championships repping GBR in my age group last year automatically qualified me for the event this year. Having been full 'ironman' distance (2.4 mile swim, 112 mile bike, 26.2 mile run) at 'Challenge Almere' in '21, this year the event was somewhat shortened to a total of 100K (2k Swim, 80k bike, 18k run) to coincide with the PTO Collins Cup (the pro triathlon equivalent of the Ryder Cup) at the X-Bionic Sphere in Slovakia (worth a Google, it's epic to say the least!).

Having suffered a stress fracture in my femur at the end of March which stopped me running for 4 months, I was transferred to the 'Aquabike' category, which is basically the swim, bike, then a 800m run to the finish (which kind of feels like cheating, ha ha).

Having had a pretty rubbish year on the sporting front thus far, I went into the event with low expectations and for the experience. My younger sister was doing the full tri repping GBR in her age group for the first time, and it had the makings of a very special trip, making memories with our mum.

Race day arrived with high winds, but fortunately the forecasted rain stayed away. The swim in the Danube was like swimming in a rough stormy ocean without the buoyancy of the salt. I only learnt to swim properly 4 years ago so this was daunting to say the least... I surprised myself with a respectable time of 40:15 and I wasn't last out the water, result!

The bike course was a long flat out and back... I was in my element! On the way out with a strong tail wind I clocked 25 miles in 52 mins, averaging just under 29 mph. I thought I was saving something for the headwind on the return, but it turns out I wasn't, ha ha... the wind really took it out of me to a point I felt nauseous, and it was a battle of mind over matter to just keep going. At the time I was a bit disappointed with my flagging, but in hindsight I'm chuffed with the ride which was only a few minutes slower than the professionals.

On the bike I overtook a lot of people, but I had no idea where I was in the field and was conscious there would be a lot of competitors who had a 10min head start on me after the swim. Coming into transition, I clocked one other bike on the rack... as I put on my trainers and started to run, the pain subsided from my legs as I knew I was running to a silver medal. The last 800 metres onto the blue carpet and through the finish was pure joy, I did it, another podium on a world stage.

Shortly after, I cheered my sister on to winning gold her age group, it was the perfect family weekend.

With Ironman Barcelona (injury deferred from June's IM Hamburg) in just under 5 weeks time, I'm now cramming running training to get me through the marathon at the end... please wish me luck!
