We managed to field a full team of 9 runners for the Senior Men led by team captain James Donald (pic below). Aidan Daniel was 1<sup>st</sup> home in 250<sup>th</sup> in a time of 41:52 with the remaining team all within minutes of each other. This left the team in 37<sup>th</sup> position for the 6 scorers and a brilliant 24th for the 9 scores ranking. Well done team! Amy Glynn (pic below) was the only Senior Female entry for this year's championship.

Alex Hammond managed a respectable 75<sup>th</sup> (36:21) in the Junior Men. Performances of the day went to Tilly Nickel who finished 20<sup>th</sup> (19:26) in the U17 Women and Tobi Loughlin (pic below) 24<sup>th</sup> (15:33) in the U15 Boys events. Other commendable runs came from Stanley Wyatt 70<sup>th</sup> (16:12) also in the U15 Boys and Olivia Paul 79<sup>th</sup> (12:33) in the U13 Girls.

The Wokingham Half Marathon is a great course for a PB but it is not flat with an early hill, dead turn and several motorway bridges to tackle. However, if you get over those hills at a good tempo you are rewarded with long and fast descents.

Like last year the weather looked like it was going to be cold and/or raining but on the day the sun shone brightly - with a fairly strong head wind on the outbound 10/15k.

#### How I got on:

My race was run on the premise that I would kick for home after the last hill with around 2k to go. From Coach Paul's sessions, I am getting a good idea of what pace I can hold and for how long at the end of a race. However, I misjudged my splits in the middle section believing I was doing better than I was, so I had a shock when it looked like I had 7 or so minutes left. The planned kick at the end turned into a desperate grasp at matching my pb or at least getting close (please don't look at the race photos - they're all teeth and grimaces). At first, it looked like I crossed the line 1 second over but official results had me 2 seconds under. Phew.

I do highly recommend this race; it's well organised, there is good competitive runners at all levels and pacers up to 1:25 (there was last year), but it is a long drive on the M4 and parking is tight when getting there late - but I scrapped a 2 second improvement so sort of worth it?!?



# Parkrun Championships update

February

I write this latest Parkrun update having been lucky enough to just have returned from cycling for a week with Bath CC in Spain. Our group was a mixture of those I knew and didn't, but as we bonded together over the week, we supported each other and together completed rides we wouldn't have managed on our own and I think we all returned stronger. This month I've also seen the same in Parkrun, with groups forming and testing each other and, as a result, running faster times than they would have otherwise. It's one of the benefits that the regular, informal, competition of Parkrun brings. Looking at the first cut of the overall championships this is plainest in the women's category, where Creina O'Shea turned around a 7 second deficit at Bath to beat Ella Treby by 9 seconds at Chippenham the week after (Ella leads the overall standings though, due to also having run a fast time at Pomphrey Hill). They ran the 2nd and 3rd fastest times of the month too, just a few seconds behind Issy Davies who ran 19:41 at the non-Championship Moors Valley course.

Early days in the men's competition with Tobi Loughlin the only top 5 runner to have completed more than one course. His 17:34 average is in touch with Aidan Daniel's 17:02 that currently leads the way. A nice win for James Donald at Somerdale opened his Parkrun account at the top of the V40s, and with 11 V50s already competing, that again looks to be making a bid as the most competitive category. Remember it's your age midway through the year (1st July) that sets your age category for the year. The fastest TBAC men's time anywhere this month was Alex Carter's 16:26 at Lydiard.

Reminder: we will be targetting Somerdale Pavilion parkrun on 11th March. Lift sharing, post run cafe details etc, will be shared on the TBAC Parkrun WhatsApp.
