European standard distance Duathlon Champs19th March

Andy Alcorn and I headed off to Italy to contest the Europeans last weekend, just outside of Venice. A somewhat chilly early start for a flat but twisting 4-lap 10km run round the cobbled streets and beachfront of Caorle, we then dashed through T1 and headed out onto the fast flat 2-lap 40k bike route into the surrounding countryside. Rolling back into T2 (I took a slight detour at one roundabout when the marshal forgot to tell me which way to go!) it was out for the final 5k run.

Andy made his first Top-Ten with a solid 8th in MV55-59 only a minute behind 6th place. I moved up to the FV50-54 category and was delighted to take my first European AG Gold, coming home 9th overall.







The Sapphire League

Many of the larger SW regional clubs hold Open meeting athletics events to provide competition exposure to athletes across the region. The Sapphire League is a points-based league system (similar to the Diamond League) that athletes can elect to register for specific events held at nominated Open Meetings, defined as the South West Open Series. This is in addition to entering the event with the host club, so an athlete must enter

first in the usual way then elect to register your performance before the event takes place using the Jotform link.

For 2023 the confirmed "Open Series" events are;

- 1. Yeovil Open 8th April 2023
- 2. Yeovil Open 10th April 2023
- 3. Yate Throws and Jumps Open 15th April 2023
- 4. Yate Sprints and Hurdles Open 16th April 2023
- 5. Exeter Open 25th July 2023
- 6. Newguay and Par Open 19th August 2023
- 7. Yeovil Games Open Meeting 9th Sept 2023
- 8. Bournemouth Open Meeting 10th Sept 2023

Sapphire League scoring is from 8 points to 1 point for each of the nominated events. The nominated events for 2023 Season are:

In the Under 17 Age group; 3k, 800, 200, 100, LJ, HJ, Jav, Ham In the Senior Age Group; 3k, 800, 200, 100, LJ, HJ, Jav, Ham

In competition, the first registered competitor would get 8 points allocated, 8 for the winner down to zero. The points would be accumulated throughout the SW Open Series with the athlete with the highest overall point score at the end of the series becoming the League Champion and winning a Trophy or Prize.

The cost of entering the series is £10 for one event, £15 for two events, and £20 for three events.

The Sapphire League is being run on a non-profit basis by Yeovil Olympiads AC.
