After the success of the road relays in the autumn, we were ready to build on the 'road relay momentum' and enter a strong team in the Midland 12 Stage Road Relay. The 12 stages involved 4 long legs of 8.5km each and 8 short legs, each 5km long.

Alex Carter started the team off with an impressive 27:30, finishing leg 1 in 6th overall. The remaining 3 long legs were completed by Dan Soltys, Dan Jones and Elliott Avis in 29:52, 29:54 and 29:06, respectively, leaving Team Bath in 11th heading into the short legs.

Sam Rawes started the 5k legs with a 17:41 clocking on the 'not flat' course. Next up were Alex Tanner (17:51), Andy Fooks (16:59), Pete Grist (17:02) and Aaron Pritchard (16:10) where positions were exchanged with Worcester and North Somerset AC, leaving us in a close showdown for the top 10. Ewen Malloch (17:57), Owen Lythell (19:07) and Aidan Daniel (17:14) closed well and confirmed our top 10 finish.

After over 4 hours of racing and cheering, TBAC had achieved one of their most successful 12 Stage Relay performances to date, comfortably qualifying for the National 12 Stage Road Relays on the 15th April.

Track & Field - New Season Updates

Track season has started again so first results of the season. Three of my athletes went to Stoke Gifford last night (27th March) for the Avon/SGS meeting. Otis Poole had a comfortable win in the U/17 with 1.70 whilst two others made promising debuts for the club. 13 year old Marley Adams finished second in the U15 boys with 1.40 whilst 12 year old Ezra Ebanks won the U/15 girls with 1.35, both in the first competition. Stanley Wyatt finished second in his heat of the U/15 boys 100 m in 13.4. Yeovil next stop.

Jamie Semple travelled to Portsmouth for the Open Meeting today (2nd April) and was rewarded with a new personal best of 1.70, an improvement of 10cm, in his first outdoor competition as an U/17 athlete, finishing in second place, losing only on countback.

TeamBath had a super day at Yeovil on Saturday (8th April) at their Spring Open Meeting, both in track and on the field (pics above and below).

TeamBath high jumpers dominated the male field with four of the top five being Bath jumpers. Leading the way was Peter Krunity-Salako with a winning jump of 1.90, equalling his pb, in his first outdoor competition as an U/20. He was closely followed by Otis Poole with a new pb of 1.85, he is in his first year as U/17. Tom Blackburn, now also U/20, jumped 1.70, a height equalled by Jamie Semple as a first year U/17 which also equalled his pb, set at Portsmouth the previous week. In the girls competition, Daisy Duncan produced two new personal bests to win with 1.55, Darcy Crossman was fourth with 1.35.

On the track there were wins for Rory Osborne in the U/13 800 m in a new pb of 2.32.10, Jemima Woods in her first competition, in the U/17 100 m in 13.61, Jamie Semple (again) in the U/17 100 m in 12.18, a new pb, Katie Mackintosh, competing for Newark at Yeovil but second claim for Bath, in the 400 m hurdles in 62.78 and first in their age group were Felix Vaughan in the SM hammer with 41.37, Maria Thorne in the U/20 long jump with 4.89. Second in their age groups were Maisey Harvey in theSW hammer with 40.04, Iain "Oz" Osborne in SM hammer with 30.89, Jemima Woods in U/17 hurdles in 14.43 and Alice Bassett in U/15 100 m in 14.52. Third places went to Mia Bates in SW 400 m hurdles in 66.75, Josh Maxwell in U/17 s/c in 4.47.41, Nicholas van Beneden in U/17 100 m in 12.13, Will Semple in U/17 100 m in 12.77. Other performances were Darcy Crossman 135 in U/15 girls high jump, Noah Dyson 12.41 in U/17 100 m and Maria Thorne 14.20 in U/20 100m.

Hatherley finishing in 1:44:39 (7th FV35), Ilana Wigfield 1:47:22 (4th FV55), Beccy Tarling 1:48:10 and Helen Donald 1:56:44.

At the **Pultney& Fulham HM** Lizzi Pitt finished 3rd Female in a time of 1:34:46 (pic below) and Chris Milbourne finished 10th in a time of 1:24:17.

At the **Kew Gardens HM** Matt Levett ran 1:27:25 as part of his ongoing marathon training (pic below).

At the London Landmarks HM Louis O'Shaughnessy finished in a PB of 1:22:48.

At the **Devizes HM** Matt Lay finished in 1:31:33.

Shorter distance at the **Highworth 5** TBAC's Michael Towler had an impressive run winning in 26:56 almost 2 minutes ahead of his nearest rival.







Parkrun Championship UpdateMarch

For some of the softer underfoot courses, spring Parkrunning should bring faster times. At least that's the theory. With our focus Parkrun in March being Somerdale Pavilion, I turned up at the beginning of March to run the course, check out cafe options, car parking, etc, and was able to run round easily in flat shoes. By the time I ran again the week after, wet March had got going and my flat shoes had me slip-sliding around. I returned the week after with spikes, only to discover Somerdale can really get quite wet and longer spikes would have been better. By the end of March the rain had won, with the first two events in

April cancelled altogether.

There were some though who made better footwear / course choices. Teignmouth Promenade is obviously a good surface, as Alex Carter ran the fastest Parkrun of all TBACers in March, with 16:01. Not for the first time, Isabel Davies led the women's rankings, with 19:40 at Colby. Alex also leads the championship standings, although as Alex has only a single championship run so far, perhaps it is Tobi Loughlin we should be looking at with half the required runs for the championship completed. Last year's junior champion, Ella Treby, is making a successful start to her senior career as she leads the women's rankings, having completed four of the six parkruns. **Note:** from next month I'll start excluding all runners with a single Championship run from the published results (I'll keep them in my main results spreadsheet, so do keep completing them), so we have a clearer view of who is leading the way in the different categories. Perhaps the weather will stay dry and we'll see some really competitive times.
