British Duathlon Championships 29th October 2023

Last Sunday the domestic duathlon season climaxed at Grafham Water in Huntingdon, where British Triathlon hosted the standard distance national duathlon Championships. The very best multi-sporters turned out to flex their skills one last time this year, and it was lovely to see so many familiar faces, including of course fellow TBACers, Marianne Carpenter and Andy Alcorn.

Overnight rain thankfully eased off to make for a dry'ish run-bike-run over 10k-40k-5k. Not an especially technical course, although the run route did meander off-road through a slippy mud section which made a mess of everyone's shiny Alphaflies. And the open road bike section left you at the mercy of local traffic, which presented hazards for both Marianne and I. But we got through it unscathed, just.

The race was a big deal for me. Exactly one year since I slipped my disc. I had decided at the start of the year to focus on this shorter (standard) distance for fear of risking another "slippage" if I persisted in pursing my preferred long distance duathlon World Champs. I had even sacrificed running the Bath Half - one of my fav events - as it was just two weeks before this race; an especially painful decision when I looked on with envy at everyone's impressive times in the near-perfect conditions, knowing I was on PB form.

But I have no regrets. I went into the race having won a European standard distance duathlon qualifier just 4 weeks previous, so after bagging another quality block of training, I stood on the start line feeling quietly confident of my chances. I had trod the usual injury-

tightrope as training intensified during the final months, somehow managing to tick off every session while navigating several niggles. I was sooo very ready.

As the race unfolded, on two occasions I did my best to mess things up - firstly by dropping my chain at a junction on the bike; secondly by taking forever to remove my helmet in T2 with frozen fingers. But I pressed on, never really knowing if there was someone as old as me ahead of me. And as it turned out, there never was. I crossed the finish line to see no.1 supporter Mrs B (and Brian #iykyk) who checked the live tracker, confirming that I'd achieved my A race/goal this year - British Champion (OV50) - wohoo!

But I wasn't the only TBAC British Champ. Fellow V50 competitor, Marianne Carpenter also claimed top spot on the podium to complete a remarkable set of duathlon results this year: English Champ; British Champ; European Champ; World Champ! Interestingly, from what I can tell by the results, Marianne was chasing down the third TBACer racing at Grafham Water, Andy Alcorn. In the end, after 2hrs 18mins of racing, Andy finished just two seconds ahead, placing him a very commendable 8th OV55.
