Cross-country Gloucester League 4th November By Paul King

A big TBAC turn-out at Cirencester Park for Race 1 of the Gloucester XC League. There were over 30 TBAC men competing both for the team and the age group category competitions.

Some superb performances from the Senior Men in particular Leon Chevalier (photo below) taking an impressive 1st place in 35:47 on a very challenging and muddy course, closely followed by James Reeder 2nd (36:28) and Chris Pickering 3rd (37:01). Strong runs from Sean Barry (5th; 38:06), Pete Dyson (7th, 38:18) and Aidan Daniel (8th, 38:29) ensured that the senior men were comfortable team winners over competition rivals University of Bath and Western Tempo. TBAC Masters Men (now categorised as 35 years of age and above) demonstrated their strength in depth finishing in 1st place ahead of Western Tempo. Lots of strong contributions with the top scoring four being Andy Fooks (11th; 38:50); Dan Jones (21st; 40:47); Tom Davies (25th; 41:36) and James Donald (31st; 42:18).

The TBAC Senior Women were also out in force hoping to defend their Senior Women's title from last year. Cover photo above. Another commanding performance from Amber Gascoigne meant she finished 1st Senior & Masters Lady in a time of 27:11 (photo below). Amber was strongly supported by Annabelle Wallace (2nd LU20; 29:52) and Bethan Francis (4th SL; 30:16). Official team placings confirmed that TBAC tied for 1st place with the University of Bath.

TBAC Masters Women (35years of age and above) led home by Amber Gascoigne (1st; 27:11) and well supported by Ruth McKean (19th; 31:25) and Marianne Carpenter (34th; 32:47) took 1st place, ahead of a strong Cheltenham & County Harriers team.

There were lots of excellent contributions from the rest of the men's and ladies' teams with age group podium places for many.

The TBAC younger age groups also had an excellent day particularly in the U17 Men; U15 Boys & Girls and U11 Boys (see below results).


Over the Hills 5th November By Paul King
