The GLL Sport Foundation is an athlete focussed support programme providing athletes across the UK with tangible support to aid their sports performance. Support is available for those competing at a Regional level and above. The Foundation has provided cash awards to many athletes that train at the University Bath since 2015. Previous local recipients include Stephanie Millward, Calum Jarvis, Kieran Bird (Swimming), Joseph Choong, Joanna Muir (Modern Pentathlon), and Marcus Wyatt (Skeleton).

Financial awards are available up to the value of £1,250. Since its inception the Foundation has provided over 17,000 athlete award bursaries nationally, totalling over £9 million worth of support. The Foundation has supported athletes in B&NES since 2015 and in 2019 we supported over 100 athletes (from 26 different sports) from Bath and North East Somerset with award support totalling over £70,600.
