the most competitive, and the Ladies certainly the most competitive, they have ever seen. <sup>25/06/2024, 21:05</sup>This point was driven home by Stage 1 being world large Harriers in a time that took almost 2.5 minutes off the previous long-standing record.

Across the three TBAC teams there were a great number of stand out performances, but of particular note are the Ladies who took second place overall (photo below) and were winners of the Queens of the Mountains competition (combined time across the 6 classified mountain stages). They also bagged three individual stage wins and a course record, and only lost out on first overall to a Les Croupiers Ladies side that went under 24 hours for the first time ever.

Despite some last minute challenges, the Open team put in a club best performance, and were successful in taking 20 minutes off the previous club record to finish in 20hrs25 and eighth position, with three veteran stage winners. That this time is 35 minutes faster than the 2017 TBAC Open team that came third overall is a testament to the rapidly increasing quality of the competition. The Vets team also had some late in the day challenges to overcome and so became a more sociable-focused team, but which at least meant everyone who was available got the chance to take part and run a stage.
