## Southwest Intercounty Championships Exeter Arena 29th July

Twenty-seven athletes from the club made the journey down to Exeter Arena to compete in the annual Southwest Intercountry Championships and contested in 41 events across the day on a very hot summer day. The results matched the conditions with 27 medals, including 12 gold and a total of 15 personal bests being achieved.

Arguably the highlight of the day was the double-double gold medals of Ashley Avis and Jake Cover. Ashley securing a new 100m wind legal personal best of 10.83s, a time which pushes him into the top 35 U20 sprinters in the country, following a very short recovery after winning the 200m with a jog over the line in 22.80s. Jake matching this with 14.77s in the 100m hurdles and a season's best of 11.01 in the senior 100m.

Other double medallists included rising star Jemima Woods, starting the day with a convincing win in the 300m hurdles in a PB of 47.41s, and then hard-fought silver medal in the U17 women's 200m in an impressive PB 25.96s. The first time she has broken the 26s barrier, and an impressive performance considering she ran two 300m (heats/semi-finals) at the Age Group England Athletics Championships just the day before. William Willetts also getting double medals with a Triple Jump gold in a new PB of 13.37m and bronze in the U20 400m hurdles.

The high jump squad was once again in full force with Gold medals for Peter Krunity-Salako, a 1.80m PB for Jamie Semple, and a silver for James Boyd in a PB of 1.75m. Jamie Semple also achieved a season best in the 200m to secure the Bronze. Ella Delin also securing a silver in a new PB of 1.35 in the U13 girls' high jump. Savana Krunity-Salako ensured there was no sibling rivalry on the journey home with a Gold and 35:55 PB in the U17 women's Hammer.

U15 Frankie Pethers doubled up with a Gold in the 200m in 24.85s and a 12.30s in the 100m for sixth place. There was also a Gold medal for U17 Daniel Phelps in the 1500m Steeplechase in a PB of 4:47.41s and a Gold for senior 400m hurdler Dominic Flavell. Tobi Loughlin and Will Semple secured silver medals in the 3000m and 100m respectively, both in personal bests.

Poppy Feasey and Kyle Williams running in the 1500m steeplechase both took away the silver in with personal best times. Olivia Paul running a PB of 10:27.80 in the 3000m. There were also double bronze medals for U15 Mia McMullan in the 100m and long jump, a bronze medal for javelin thrower Sam Walker, a bronze for George Isgrove U20 100m hurdles, and a bronze for Harry Glover in the U17 200m.

All in all a great day. It was great to see so many from the club attending this event whether in the Blue & Yellow or their county colours. The successes show the strength in depth of the club and the hard work of the athletes and coaching groups.
