
A real mixture this week. First up, Ellie Leather ran an impressive 4:36 outdoor PB in the **5**th **Avenue New York Mile** finishing 18th Female in the race.

At the **Great North Run** Anna Domville (nee Clark) was competing in the elite women's race but unfortunately the blustery conditions meant that she finished in 21st albeit in a solid time of 79:26. Chris Quick MV45 managed a very creditable 1:31:38. Photo below.

At the other end of the race distance spectrum a number of TBACers were tackling the legendary **Welsh Dragon's Back Race** covering 368km of mountainous trail spread over 6 days. Nina Davies (photo above) ran an impressive race finishing 46th overall; 6th Female and 1st FV50 in a total time of 72:00:42 with Chris Maxwell (cover photo) close behind finishing 66th overall and 4th MV50 in a time of 74:56:38. Tom Hutchison (photo below) also completed the 'Hatchling' version of the race finishing an excellent 2nd overall; 1st MV70 in a total time of 48:21:30.

At the **Stockholm Half Marathon** Harry Deacon (photo below) finished in a solid time of 1:32:23 and Nigel Osborne in a time of 1:43:54.

And finally local to home at the **Compton Bassett 5-mile** road race there was good representation from TBAC with Alex Hearn finishing 5th in a time of 29:23. Phil King (10th; 4th MV50; 30:00) finished just ahead of Steve Rose (11th; 5th MV50; 30:06) in the battle of the Vets.









Long distance duathlon World Championships 8th September



Last Sunday, I became an age-group World Champion. It's still sinking in. Five years after taking up duathlon, I finally achieved the pinnacle of the sport I've grown to love. Zofingen in Switzerland is duathlon's spiritual home (aka "the Kona of duathlon") and once again it played host to World Triathlon's self-proclaimed toughest race, the long distance duathlon World Championships. A 10k-150k-30k run-bike-run, that takes in some horribly steep trails on foot and repeated technical hills on the bike. It scared the out of me the first time I raced it in 2019. So of course I kept coming back for more, this time my fourth attempt at glory.

Did I have the perfect race? Of course not - I assert that's impossible during 7 hours' racing. But I got enough things right. And the months of consistent, hard training, ensured I had just enough to get me over the line to take an age-group world title, just ahead of my

German rival Stephan who has become a great friend following our battles on the international duathlon stage.

So with my dream accomplished, what next? Right now, I've got no idea. But one thing is for sure... in a few weeks' time I'll be brought firmly back down to earth by the annual humbling experience that is the cross-country league season... ouch!
