# Wild 70 - Wildstrubel by UTMB 13th September

On 13th September I took part in the Wildstrubel 70k, a UTMB World Series event in Switzerland. The weather that week changed swiftly from summer to winter, creating a nightmare for the organisers. We were meant to run a point to point race from Kandersteg to Crans Montana but the conditions made the original route impossible as we would have had to cross a mountain pass at over 2600m which was on race day buried under 1m20 of fresh snow, battered by 50km/h winds and temperatures of -20C.

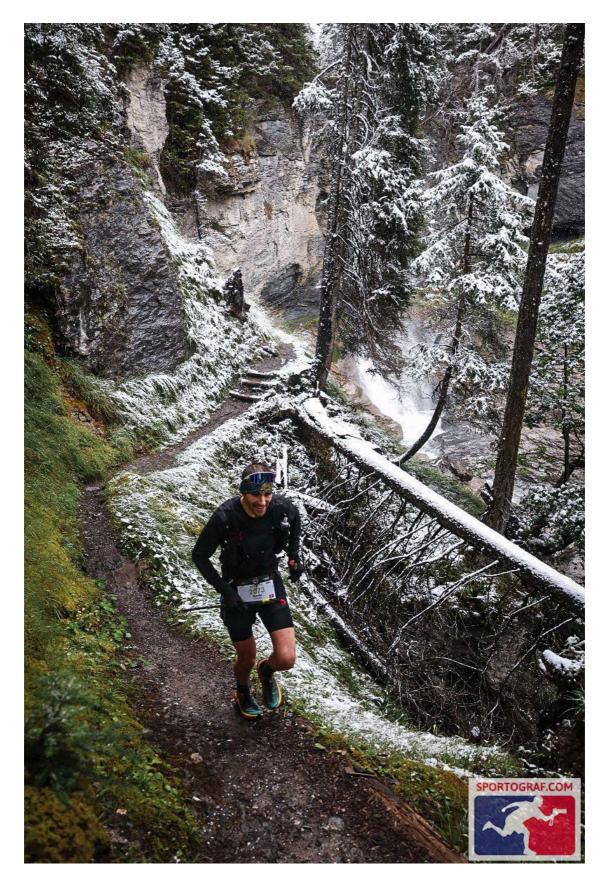
Hats off to the organisers who managed to redraw a route 48hrs before the event. The new route was 74km long with 3600m of elevation, a sort of out and return from Crans Montana with some steep climbs but fairly untechnical terrain. It snowed all day, and we had -10 degrees at times, but it was not really an issue, at least for me.

I had a simple plan, steady pace for the first 30k and start pushing from there on. Many runners started too fast, and I started taking over people progressively from the 20k mark. Feeling good, I started my move forward at the bottom of the biggest climbing section of the race. In the space of 15km I managed to overtake a few runners I let run past me earlier, and catch up Julie Roux, the female winner, who had almost 10min on me at the previous aid station.

We had a penultimum aid station back in Crans Montana before embarking on a 20k loop, where I saw the ranking for the first time. Realising I was in 18th place, I quickly picked up my bottles and some gels. This final section felt endless at times, but I was moving well

and catching up with other runners. I underestimated the elevation left at this point, as we still had a section with nearly 900m for 10k. This slowed me down a bit on the final 5k as I could really feel my legs at this point, and it took some mental strength to push to the finish line.

Final result - 13th overall in 7h35 and a 755 index.

## Bath Hilly Half 17th November 2024

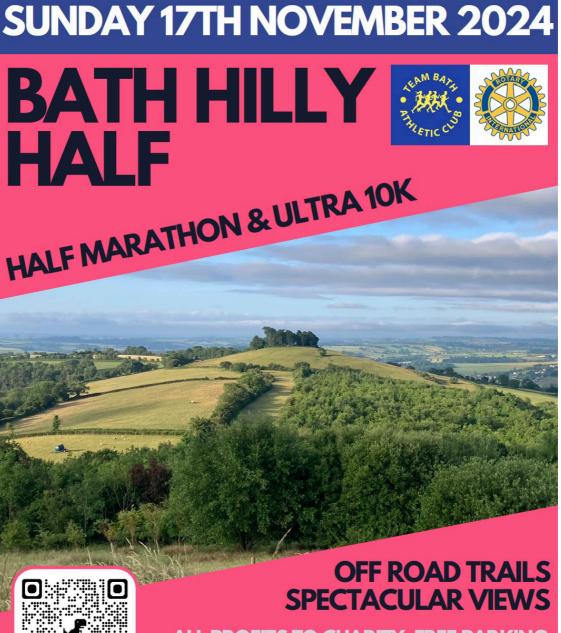
